

Prescription Medication Disposal Procedure

DIRECTIONS:

Remove pills from the original container and put them in a sealed ziplock bag before placing them in the drug drop box. Empty pill bottles may be disposed of in your home recycling.

Liquid Medications should remain in original bottles.

DROP:

- Unused and/or expired medications
- Over the counter medications
- Prescription medications

DO NOT DROP:

- Sharps (needles, syringes, lancets etc)
- Chemical waste/mercury products
- Electronic glucose monitors
- Non-medical inhalers
- Commercial/business/long-term care deposits

DISPOSAL SITES:

- Fond du Lac Police Department—use drop box located inside the lobby of the police department 126 Main Street. (Open Monday-Friday 8:00am – 4:00pm.) Phone: 920-322-3700
- North Fond du Lac Police Department—use drop box located inside of the police department at 16 Garfield St. (Open Monday-Friday, 8:00am—4:30 pm) Phone: 920-929-3760
- Campbellsport Police Department—use drop box located inside the lobby of the Village Hall at 177 E. Main St. (Open Monday-Friday, 7:30am—4:00pm) Phone: 920-533-5391
- Ripon Police Department—use drop box located inside the main entrance at 100 E. Jackson St. (Open 24 hours/7days a week) Phone: 920-748-2888
- Waupun Police Department—use drop box located in the lobby at 16 E. Main St. (Open Monday-Friday, 8:00am-4:00pm) Phone: 920-324-7903
- Village of Oakfield-use drop box located in the lobby of the Village Office at 130 N. Main St. (Open Monday/Wednesday/Friday, 8:00am-7:00pm and Tuesday/Thursday, 8:00am-4:00pm) Managed by the Oakfield Police Department-Phone: 920-517-1570

REMEMBER:

- Secure your medications and know who has access to your medicine cabinet.
- It is a criminal offense to share prescription medications; even with a family member.
- It is not acceptable to flush or throw medication away. Use your local disposal drop off sites.
